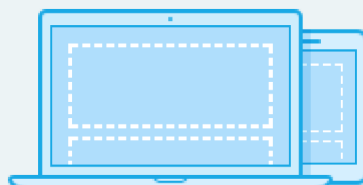

RWE - Great Yarmouth Pipeline (Bacton to Great Yarmouth Power Station) - 2nd Nov

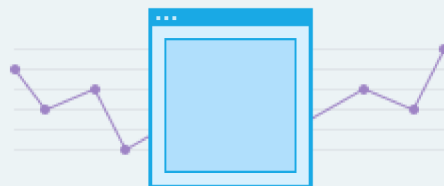
